Dr. Pollak received BS and MD degrees from Northwestern University and completed an orthopaedic surgery residency at the integrated Case Western

Reserve University/University Hospitals of Cleveland program. In 1994, he completed a fellowship in orthopaedic trauma at the University of California Davis Medical Center. He has served in the past as Treasurer, Chair of the Extremity War Injuries Project Team and as Chair of the Board of Specialty Societies for the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons. He is a Past President of the Orthopaedic Trauma Association and the Maryland Orthopaedic Association. Dr. Pollak has served on the faculty of the University of Maryland School of Medicine since 1994 and has held numerous leadership positions. He has served in the past as Head of the Division of Orthopaedic Traumatology and Chair of the Department of Orthopaedics at the University of Maryland School of Medicine.

Dr. Pollak previously served as Chair of the Maryland Health Care Commission, Medical Director of the Baltimore County Fire Department, Special Deputy US Marshal and Vice Chair of the Major Extremity Trauma Research Consortium. His current responsibilities include editor of the Prehospital Trauma Life Support textbook. Immediately prior to assuming his current role, Dr. Pollak served UMMS as SVP for Clinical Transformation.
